
BIO

PLEIN AIR SHOW AT EAST SHORE UNITARIAN CHURCH: JANUARY 6 TO MARCH 23

Our EAFA plein air group is featured in an exhibit at EAST Shore Unitarian Church 12700 SE 32nd St, Bellevue, WA 98005. The theme of the show is "MINDFULNESS IN PLEIN AIR PAINTING", inspired by an article about plein air painting in Nature Conservancy magazine titled "Have a Brush With Nature". Each artist also submitted a short statement about "mindfulness" and their paintings. The show goes up Monday January 6 and runs until March 23 in the church foyer. The church is open 9:00 am to 7:00 pm Monday through Friday, and 9:00 am to 1:00 pm on Sundays. Free parking in upper lot, off SE 32nd Street, is closest to our Sanctuary, it has handicap and stroller parking. There is a roundabout for drop-offs. Lower, main parking lot is also off SE 32nd Street. Park only near stairs that will lead you up to the Sanctuary or street parking on 32nd Street.
