DAN RILEY

Brief Art Bio:



My main painting interests are portraits and figures. I enjoy painting people working, people in interesting situations, people displaying emotions (joy - sadness - anger -

whatever). By far, most of my paintings involve people doing something. My secondary interest is landscapes.

I stay active in art. In normal times, I attend figure drawing sessions on

Sundays at the UW.. I do plein air (outdoor) painting with artists from the Evergreen Association of Fine Arts (EAFA), and I paint live models every week at the Eastside Artists Collaborative (EAC) studio in the Overlake area of Bellevue.





Besides creating art I enjoy teaching art. Over the years I've taught workshops on portrait and figure painting as well as other aspects of art technique. I fairly regularly do art demos at the Daniel Smith art stores and at meetings of local art groups.

I'm involved in the local art community, particularly with EAFA, and have served as the president of that organization as well as president of the Puget Sound Group of Northwest

Artists. At the present time I am president of the Timber Ridge Art Association. I'm also a member of the American Portrait Society, a member of the Plain Air Painters of

Washington (PAWA). a former signature member of the Northwest Watercolor Society (NWWS) and a former member of the Northwest Pastel Society. I've painted in most media but these days I paint almost exclusively in oil.



I love a good line. The capture of a look, a gesture or an



emotion with the simplicity of a clean line is almost magical to me. I've always admired the great artists

from antiquity to modern times who, with a few pencil strokes, can evoke feelings of passion, excitement, humor, grace and elegance in the mind of the viewer. A simple line from a master artist can be as powerful as a great sentence from a gifted writer.

I love tonal value. Some artists are passionate about color and are

able to evoke emotion just from skillful blending of colors on the surface. But I am much more excited by rich patterns of dark and light in a drawing and a full range of shades in between.
